### **CENTENNIAL NEWS**

- **A New Carmel** - On May 16, 1936, the feast of St. Simon Stock, Bishop Jules Jeanmard joyfully celebrated the first Mass for the new Carmelite community in Lafayette. The new Carmel would be under the title of Mary, Mother of Grace. Originally situated on three acres of land on Old Spanish Trail in Lafayette, the community would eventually move near Immaculata Seminary. In 1956, the Sisters moved into their new and permanent home along Carmel Drive. Because of the force of their prayers, Bishop Jeanmard often called this community the "lightning rod" of the Diocese of Lafayette.
- **Fete-Dieu du Vermilion** – will occur on the Vermilion this year on August 15<sup>th</sup>. Please mark your calendars and visit the Diocesan Centennial Webpage for more information. This year the boat procession with the Eucharist will begin in Abbeville and end at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist.
